The Finance Team is happy share this report from 2012 about God's faithfulness and your generosity. Below is a short summary of how we ended up for the year. We want also to take this opportunity to express our thanks to each of you who have invested in the ministry of Trinity Church with your faithful stewardship of God's resources, as well as to encourage you to faithful giving in the upcoming year.

2012 Budget:	\$415,480
2012 Receipts	\$413,309
2012 Disbursements	\$397,212
2012 Surplus	\$16,097

The Consistory approved that we want to further God's ministry and mission through a portion of these funds. The Mission Team will be allocating \$8000 of the surplus toward one or more mission opportunities in the coming month. Look for where these funds were distributed in next month's Connections newsletter. The remaining \$8000 will be placed in a cash reserve fund to be utilized in the upcoming year as necessary. Praise God that we ended the year in a great place and are able to bless others in ministry.



The Key to Congregational Singing....

"HIS MEN" CONCERT

On Sunday, February 17 at 6 pm, "His Men" will be presenting a concert at Trinity Reformed Church, 712 Apple Ave. in Holland. This is the 40th anniversary year of the group, and the Trinity concert will include a variety of music, including crowd favorites such as "This Little Light of Mine" and "Joshua Fit the Battle of Jericho".

"His Men" recently sang at the Christmas concert of the Schubert Chorus of Grand Rapids, and have sung at places as well-known as the Crystal Cathedral. While those sound like great achievements, the concerts that are most memorable to the members are those sung behind the bars of maximum security correctional facilities like the Cook County Jail in Chicago and the Bellamy Correctional Facility in Ionia. Those concerts often make up entire weekends of travel to jails, prisons, veterans homes and nursing homes all over the state of Michigan.

"His Men" has sung benefit concerts for numerous Christian organizations, including Love, Inc., International Aid, Youth for Christ and for chapel financing for Brooks Correctional Facility in Muskegon. The beneficiary of the freewill offering taken during the Trinity concert will be Humanity for Prisoners, whose current president Doug Tjapkes is a former musical director and one of the founding members of "His Men".

"His Men" has 22 singing members from Muskegon, Kent and Ottawa counties, from as far north as New Era, as far south as Holland, and as far east as Byron Center. Holland-Zeeland area members include Milt Bos, Vic Helder, Lyle Ahrenholz and Fred Groen. John Mattson, who is also director of worship arts at Central United Methodist in Muskegon, has been the director for the past 19 years and Sherry Merz is the accompanist.





7 Habits of a Highly Effective Steward

Much has been written about the habits it takes to be a highly effective person or a highly effective family or a highly effective teen. This seven-part series will reflect on the habits of a highly effective steward.

Since stewardship is a part of discipleship, and discipleship is a journey for each of us, we hope that these habits will help us reflect on this area of our Christian life.

Habit 3: Be Content

We live in a world of obsession with material possessions. Far too many of us find ourselves in debt because we've been swept up in the frenzy of accumulation. In our consumerist society, it is difficult to distinguish between our needs, and our wants and desires. We often believe that the more money we have, the happier we will be.

There's an interesting paradox when we finally recognize that nothing we have really belongs to us. Even though we have many things, none of them actually belongs to us. As we come to understand that everything belongs to God, our perspective changes...we become more content.

"Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have," (Hebrews 13:5). A Christian steward is content because he knows that God will give him everything he needs. In speaking at a regional conference, Ted Boers, chair of a stewardship task force, indicated he had just read a book by a secular author entitled, "Want What You Have". Ted commented, "This was the secular author's secret to happiness, but what a great way of restating the truth of Hebrews 13:5 ... want what you have!"

We wrestle with the question, "How much is enough?" most of our lives. What is the limit? As Christians, we need to actively seek God's guidance to help us continually differentiate between our real needs, and our wants and desires. Accept God's provision in your life, and find contentment in the source, not the supply. (I Timothy 6: 6-8).

YOUTH MINISTRY MOMENTS

My review of the book "Sticky Faith – Practical By Jon Wolters ideas to nurture long-term faith in Teenagers"

Chapter 2 — The Sticky Gospel

In this chapter the authors took a look the data they collected in regards to how students look at the gospel. One thing that struck them was that "many of our kids - even those who grew up in church - have surprising views of what it means to be a Christian." Of the 168 youth group alums that were asked to define what it means to "be a Christian", 35% didn't even mention Jesus in their answer, some of them however did mention God. The most common theme mentioned by these youth group alums was that being Christian meant to "love others", but even atheist teens would agree that loving others is a good idea.

They found that many youth group kids have adopted a "gospel of sin management". Basically what this means is that a lot of kids want to put God in a box, bringing Him out when it is convenient for them and hiding Him at inconvenient times. (a little side note here - if you want to see a great video about this, search "the skit guys—god in a box." I will also try and post this link to both our church website and our church Facebook page.) This phrase "gospel of sin management" was coined by the philosopher Dallas Willard who said: "History has brought us to the point where the Christian message is thought to be essentially concerned with only how to deal with sin: with wrongdoing or wrong-being and its effects. Life, our actual existence, is not included in what is now presented as the heart of the Christian message, or it is included only marginally . . . The current gospel then becomes a "gospel of sin management."

So how do we move form the gospel of sin management to the acknowledgement of the true gospel in the lives our teens?

The authors of "Sticky Faith" have expressed that one of the best ways to make this transition in teens is to look at Paul's words in Galatians 5:5 (But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope.)

Faith + Waiting on God = Righteousness

If we are to help our students truly understand Sticky Faith then every decision, every thought and every action comes down to this: Where do I place my trust? Do I trust my own instincts, desires, and convections, or do I trust Christ?

Another way that they have written to make this transition is to realize that Sticky Faith in teenagers is not about "doing," it's about "trusting." Kara writes on page 37: To help our kids discover and grab hold of a sustainable, long-term and vibrant Sticky Faith, we must stay true to the words of Jesus and heed the counsel of Paul: Trust in the one the Father has sent and live convinced that the only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

These last two statements from Paul are great and if a student really grasps them they could live a life of Sticky Faith, but with most students they need another factor. That factor is YOU!!! Sticky Faith is "More Caught Than Taught." "When the students in the survey were college seniors, the authors asked them how participation in their High School youth group had shaped them - both then and now. Youth group activities were rarely mentioned. Youth group talks were mentioned even less frequently. What was mentioned was the legacy of youth leaders - a legacy derived not from what the leaders said or even what they did, but more from who they were. Our own love for the Sticky Gospel of trusting God will be more caught than taught!


