7 Habits of a Highly Effective Steward

Much has been written about the habits it takes to be a highly effective person, or a highly effective family or a highly effective teen. This seven-part series will reflect on the habits of a highly effective steward.

Since stewardship is a part of discipleship, and discipleship is a journey for each of us, we hope that these habits will help us reflect on this area of our Christian life.

Habit 2: Trust God to Provide

Trust is a foundational concept for practicing stewardship. This may be one of the most difficult habits of all to develop. For many of us, it's easier to trust God for our eternal salvation than it is to trust him for our daily living. When it comes to practical things like putting food on our table or making the mortgage payment, we operate as if we are on our own. As a result we often worry and experience anxiety.

Fear is the result of our inability to trust God in all aspects of our lives. This actually causes some of us to stockpile assets beyond all reason. Others worry about every possibility of loss, including health issues, layoffs and economic collapse. There's a big difference between constructive planning – and destructive worry. There is no reason for us to be bound by fear. We need to put our trust in God and to commit both our faith and our finances to Him.

"Instruct those who are rich in this present world not. . . to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy" (I Timothy 6:17). Even though our culture tempts us to believe that accumulation brings happiness, as Christians we need to focus on trusting God. He has much to give us of far greater value than anything we can ever purchase or accumulate.

Trusting God to provide also means operating on His timetable and not our own. This is extremely difficult in many situations. We tend to want our needs met immediately. If this were always the case, there would be no opportunity for us to strengthen our faith – to believe and trust that our needs will be met according to God's plan. These opportunities help to teach us patience and reliance on God.

Youth Ministry Moments

My review of the book "Sticky Faith — Practical By Jon Wolters ideas to nurture long-term faith in Teenagers"

As I started to read the book Sticky Faith, the question that kept popping up in my mind is what is it? What is Sticky Faith? The answer came on page 20 and it was broken down into three characteristics. The first two are relevant for all ages and the last is more important for those students making the transition to college or careers. So here goes.

Sticky Faith as defined in the book is:

- 1. Both internal and external: Sticky Faith is part of a student's inner thoughts and emotions, and is also externalized in choices and actions that reflect this faith commitment. These behaviors include regular attendance in a church or campus group, prayer and bible reading, service to others, and lower participation in risk behaviors, especially sex and alcohol. In other words, Sticky Faith involves whole-person life integration, at least to some degree.
- 2. Both personal and communal: Sticky Faith celebrates God's specific care for each person while always locating faith in the global and local community of the church.
- 3. Both mature and maturing: Sticky Faith shows marks of spiritual maturity but also in the process of growth. We don't assume a high school senior or college freshman (or youth worker, for that matter) will have a completely "mature" faith. We are all in process.

(the last three statements taken from Sticky Faith pages 20 & 21)

A few thoughts that I am personally taking form this chapter. 1) Sticky Faith in teenagers does not just happen and teenagers cannot have Sticky Faith by themselves. We as a church body need to be a part of their lives - this is a topic that will come up in future chapters.

2) Start these principles of Sticky Faith early, even elementary kids will benefit from the ideas in future chapters.

Above all the research done for this book the authors have expressed that they love God and believe in God more than any amount of research. Their top suggestion is this: "Trust the Lord with your kids and continue to ask—maybe at times beg—the Lord to build Sticky Faith." (page 24 & 25)

Let me close with a story told by the author Kara Powell. This story really means something to me because I did exactly what her son did! She tells of a time when he received two sports pennants - one from each of his two favorite football teams, the San Diego Chargers and the New Orleans Saints. The first night after receiving the pennants he hung them up in his room with scotch tape. By the next morning they had fallen. The second night he hung them up with masking tape and they stayed up on the wall that night and into the next day, but by the time they got home from work and school the pennants had fallen yet again. They knew it was time to pull out the big guns so they grabbed some duct tape. The pennants stayed up on the wall that night and the next and they have remained on the wall for over three years now!!

The application for this story towards our kids is this; are we using scotch tape or masking tape to hold them up in their faith?

I think it is time to get out the Duct Tape!!!


