Holy Week at Trinity Church

Palm Sunday

Sunday, Mar 24 at 9:30am

Together we'll enter Holy Week by following Jesus into Jerusalem amidst the shouts of hosanna and the waving of palm branches. While most years we would focus on the donkey and the palms and the crowds, this year we'll unpack why the Gospel of Mark pairs this moment with Jesus cursing the fig tree outside the Temple. What gospel truth is there for us in the story of hosannas and figs?

Maundy Thursday

Thursday, Mar 28 at 6:00pm

On the night before the cross, Jesus gathered around a table with his disciples. Following his example, we'll gather around the Table to remember and believe the teaching of the Last Supper in the shadow of the cross through song and prayer and story.

Good Friday

Each household will receive a devotion and prayer to remember and mark the death of Jesus for each of us, for all of us. We will not gather together instead we'll remain scattered and alone like the disciples after his death.

Holy Saturday

Saturday, Mar 30 at 3:00-3:45pm

You are invited to gather together for a short prayer service to mark the day Jesus remained in the tomb. Our God with us even in the grave. This prayer service will focus on silence and rest, darkness and hope.

Easter Sunday

Sunday, Mar 31 at 9:30am

With the Gospel of Mark, we'll follow the women to the empty tomb as together we grapple with what the resurrection of Jesus means of us here and now. The Trinity traditions of the Flowering Cross and Handel's Messiah will help us celebrate the glory and promise of that most unexpected of mornings.
