

Palm Sunday

What gospel truth is there for us in the story of hosannas and figs?

Easter Sunday


Sunday, Mar 31 at 9:30am

Prayer Practice | Make a Palm Cross

As you travel through this Holy Week, you're invited to take a palm leaf and transform it into a cross. Whether as an individual or household, you can make a palm cross as a devotional activity to prepare you for Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Then use this palm cross to remind you of Jesus this week - keeping your attention on the gospel story in the midst of busyness and distraction.

Supplies: One palm leaf strip about 24-26" in length, 1/2" in width, tapering to the end.
