A NOTE FROM PASTOR AMANDA

Dear Trinity Family,

Over 60 years ago, this congregation tried a new thing and began to broadcast on WHTC once a month. Then eventually twice a month. Then when a spot opened up after another congregation ended their broadcast, Trinity began to broadcast every Sunday. The weekly radio broadcast eclipsed the cassette tape ministry that had been a major way that people listened to the service up until then.

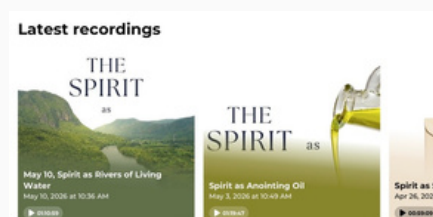
Over the decades, Trinity's WHTC broadcast became part of this congregation's identity. It has been a point of pride that our services aired on the radio where anyone could be listening. And even as budgets tightened and got smaller, Trinity sacrificed (and some even directly donated) to keep the broadcast going.

In the 1960s, Trinity had the vision to see the opportunities that radio provided: community engagement, home-bound ministry, advertising, and outreach to our city and surrounding area.

And now, six decades later, Trinity comes to another moment full of opportunities for community engagement and outreach, for reaching out and letting folks know we're here on Apple Avenue and there's a place for them with us. Whether joining us from home or taking a seat in the sanctuary.

While broadcast radio was the technology that made all that possible then, the technology that makes all that possible now is having an online presence.

Trinity has already embraced social media with our services streamed live on our Facebook page. We have refreshed and overhauled our website to make it more welcoming and user-friendly. And we also have audio of all our services in one easy-to-find place: trinityrc.mixlr.com.



As with any new thing, there comes an ending of something else. And with that change there's always going to be a learning curve and uncertainty and discomfort.

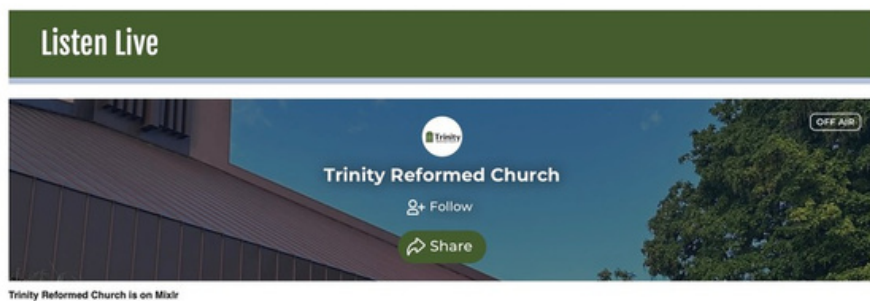
My hope is that we help and support each other through this transition. Toward that end, during the first week of June, we'll be sharing a step-by-step guide on accessing our worship services from home.

SUMMER SERMON SERIES

Growing Disciples in the Gospel of Matthew

This summer, we are exploring the Gospel of Matthew with a focus on growing as disciples.

Discipleship is a major theme of Matthew's gospel. More than the other gospels, Matthew focuses on Jesus as a teacher and rabbi, and he writes with great detail about the calling of the disciples and their ongoing formation as those who follow Jesus. And the gospel ends with that most famous of discipleship passages: *"Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded."*

Beginning with Matthew's own call to follow Jesus in Chapter 9, we will join the Twelve as they seek to grow as disciples by learning from the One they follow and from each other. And as we walk along with them, may we, as disciples of Jesus, consider how the Spirit is inviting us to grow and learn from the One we follow too.

Let us hear once again the life-changing invitation of Jesus to all who follow him: *"Come to me and take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls..."*

It is a team of people at Trinity with a special interest in God's Creation, especially here on our church grounds, but everywhere on our planet where scripture encourages us to lean in: to share beauty, practice stewardship, and be in conversation with creation.

Every Ministry Team has a name. Ours is Roots & Renewal. "Roots" suggests we will focus on planted things, like the Apple Trail, lawn, shrubs & flowers, and the church gardens. We will certainly work on "Renewal" in those areas as opportunities emerge, but our vision is bigger than "Roots".

We are also concerned about the birds, the insects, the fish, the amphibians, and all the other life that calls our church ground and our communities "home".

Did you know?

- *There have been seventy-nine species of birds spotted on our church ground?*
- *That one oak tree supports eighty-five species of butterflies and moths?*
- *That Monarch butterflies only eat milkweed as caterpillars, alongside many other species that are dependent on one plant?*
- *That Michigan has 253 species of native bee pollinators?*

Roots & Renewal wants to join in God's restorative work for all of creation. We share what we notice. We ask questions like: How can we help nature thrive? And we practice together in ministry with all of creation.

Let's Celebrate Creativity Together!

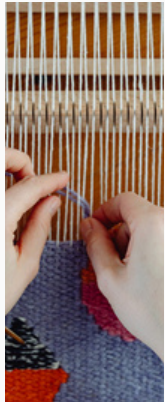
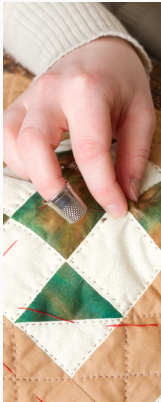

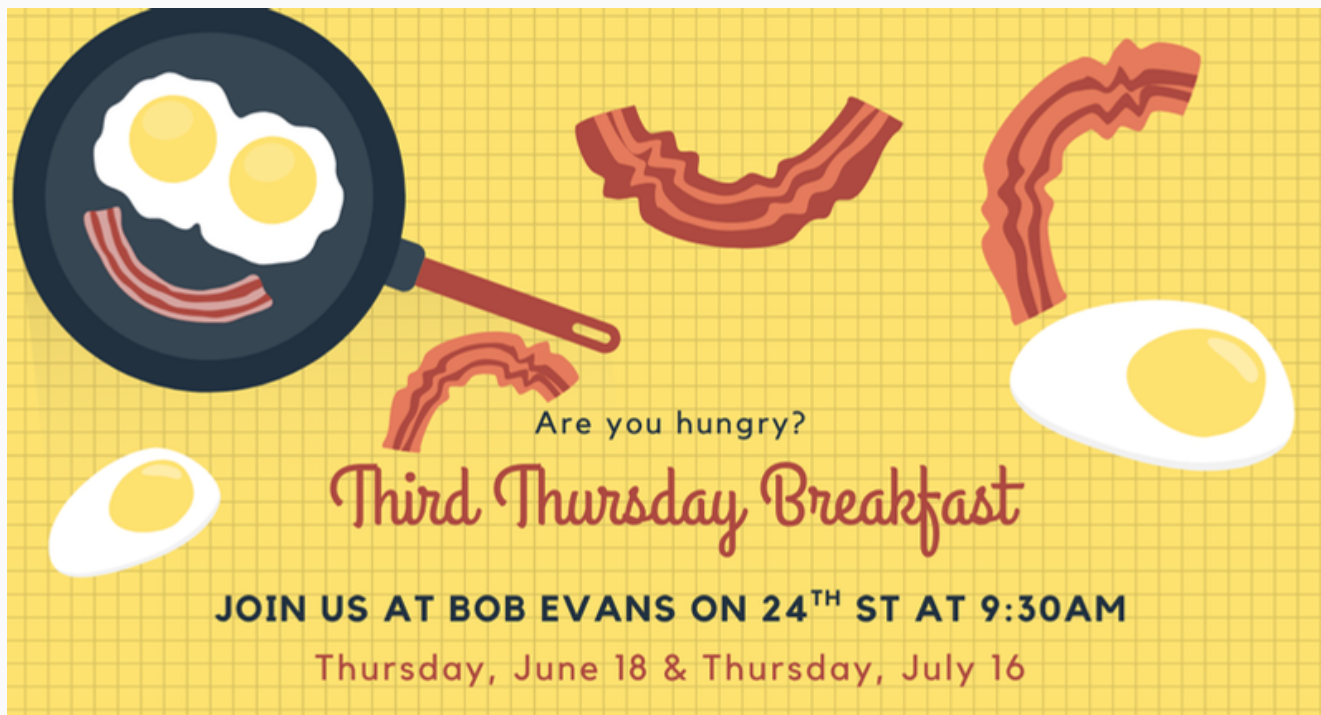

Trinity Volunteers!

Russ Johnson enjoys music! That is not a big surprise. He wanted to play trombone ever since he heard the song from the Music Man, 76 trombones.

He started playing trombone in 1962 and his father said it sounded like a love sick moose! He did not give up and played through high school and part of college. In college, his roommate started a Christian music group. Russ joined when their bass player moved away. They traveled through out Michigan in 1972 and ventured as far as the Munich Olympics that year. Several of the band members continued and formed a band named Cornerstone which toured in Germany during 1973 and 1974.

Russ continues to play trombone in the Big Band of Praise. This band has played a few times at Trinity Church. They are a music group comprised of 18 to 20 musicians and singers. The age range demonstrates that music transcends generations. Currently Jack, one of our sax players is the oldest in the band in his upper 70's, and we often have high school players join us as substitutes. We play "big band" music which has sounds of swing, jazz, gospel, and southern spirituals. The band had its beginnings at Central Wesleyan Church about 30 years ago. Only one of the original band members remains with the band, Greg Valkema. BBOP has played across Michigan including several times as the supporting band for Dave Boyer. The band has an exciting summer schedule. Please come enjoy one or more of our concerts.
