Some of you are unsure about gathering in a group, and that's ok. We hope that if you cannot yet join us, you will continue to enjoy our service on WHTC, Facebook Live, or via live stream on your computer. Some of you have been anxiously waiting to "come inside" the sanctuary, to see one another and be in community once again. It will be good to see your faces (or at least your eyes) when we come together!

The past few months of *Connections* have outlined the safety steps that are being taken as we find ourselves still in the middle of a pandemic. Masks are required the entire time you are in the building, and hand sanitizer will be located just inside the front doors as well as at the entrance of the sanctuary. And please, please, please... if you are feeling ill or anyone in your household is ill, please stay home. If you have been exposed to the Corona Virus, we also ask that you refrain from attending until given the ok by your doctor to return.

Finally, on Sunday, October 18th we will hold our Annual Congregational Meeting following the 9:30 service.
